The term Differential Diagnosis Decision Support System (DDDSS) was coined to refer specifically to the type of technology being discussed as part of the project. DDDSS was identified as a system that would allow an individual to enter clinical findings, history, and demographics, and receive a ranked differential diagnosis (DDx) based on these data. It was also important that these systems linked to some form of evidence base or educational resource for the clinicians or the public.

The 10 Most Common Diagnoses and Procedures in Primary Care

The key differential diagnosis is between pseudoclaudication due to spinal stenosis and vascular claudication. Pedal pulse examination is helpful but certainly not definitive. It is thus valuable to have the patient extend their back for 20 to 30 seconds and see if this reproduces the pain that they are getting when they walk.

They can prompt providers to think comprehensively of a differential diagnosis (such as asking ' what else do you think this could be? '), access medical knowledge on their own through reliable web sources and help prevent diagnostic errors by participating in follow-up and feedback.99 – 101 Ensuring longitudinal patient follow-up beyond the consultation is particularly important in primary care, given the non-specific presentation and evolution of many serious diseases over time.102 ...

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
