Dual coding – making connections between text and visuals – is a learning strategy. Teaching strategies (methods) that could apply dual coding might be mind mapping, brainstorming, doodling, sketching, diagramming, etc. Another example: Retrieval practice is a learning strategy and a teaching strategy that applies to this could be a brain dump.

Strategies for teaching visual learners: Use visual aids - most other learners will benefit from visual elements as well. Provide visual analogies and metaphors to help with visual imagery. Sometimes graphics are not easy to use for specific topics but consider writing key points in front of the class as this provides visual cues.

The main goal of learning strategies is to get students to become more effective learners. Research on the topic has shown us plenty of different ways to do that. But the three most famous learning strategies are mnemonic, structural, and generative.

3 Types of Learning Strategies - Exploring your mind

Strategies can be very different in nature, ranging from planning the organisation of one's learning (a metacognitive learning strategy) through using mnemonic devices to learn vocabulary (cognitive learning strategies) and rehearsing what one expects to say (a performance strategy) to bolstering one's self-confidence for a language task by means of "self-talk" (an affective strategy).

If used effectively, peer assessment – a formative assessment strategy that encourages students to comment on the work of their peers – can improve students' understanding of success criteria, help them to become more engaged in learning and develop their interpersonal skills (Black et al., 2003; Topping, 2017), as well as potentially even reducing teacher workload.

Students use the following learning strategies most often when learning a language: 1. Cognitive Strategies. When they manipulate the language material using indirect ways, e.g. through reasoning, analysis, note-taking, and synthesizing. 2. Metacognitive Strategies.
